Everywhere I visit in the City of Manassas I see evidence of the statement on the City seal “*Rich in Historic Interest.*” Indeed the community is proud of its rich historic heritage and is looking at ways

to preserve and enhance how people can experience these historic traditions.

This has made me think a little about my own history. I grew up in eastern North Carolina as the oldest of four siblings. My parents were both small business owners; my father a Chiropractor and my mother owned a florist/gift shop.

One of my grandfathers was a farmer in North Carolina who died very young. What's in the Time Capsule?

On Oct. 12, 2013, City of Manassas Utilities celebrated 100 years of service to the community. During the celebration a time capsule was buried in front of the building. The time capsule is scheduled to be opened in 50 years. Mayor Parrish, members of City Council, members of the Utilities Commission and staff were there to mark this historic occasion.

So, what's in the time capsule? The City created a commemorative book for the 100th anniversary that went in the capsule. Also in the capsule is the following: an old electric meter and new electric meter, an old water meter and new water meter, the cover off of a hydrant meter, an old bell-type arrestor and new arrestor, a copy of the FY 2014 budget, and a copy of a current utility bill.

Not knowing what the future holds, but realizing that many things are going electronic, it will be interesting for future generations to open this capsule and compare these items from the past to what they have in 2063. Who knows, they might not even use paper by then.

Cybercriminals don't just send fraudulent email messages and set up fake websites. They might also call you on the phone and claim to be from Microsoft. They might offer to help solve your computer problems or sell you a software license. Once they have access to your computer, they have access to any information on your computer, like passwords and bank account numbers.

To make the process more efficient, City staff worked out a system for individuals to bypass the larger shredders for quicker service. In all, 13,400 pounds were shredded and recycled!
