Photo ID Required for In-Person Voting

Election Day is Tuesday, Nov. 4, 2014. Voters will now be required to present one of the following forms of photo identification when voting in-person:

- Valid Virginia Driver's License
- DMV-issued photo identification card
- Valid United States passport
- Valid employee photo identification card
- Other government-issued photo identification card
- Valid college or university Student Photo Identification card (issuer must be an institution of higher education located in Virginia)

If any voter does not have one of these forms of Photo ID, please visit the Voter Registration office to obtain a free Voter Photo ID card. This ID will be valid for voting purposes only. Please note: with limited exceptions, Photo ID is not required for Absentee Voting by mail.

Important Election Dates to Remember:

- Sept. 19: Absentee Voting begins
- Oct. 14: Last Day to Register to Vote
- Oct. 28: Last Day to Request a mailed Absentee Ballot
- Nov. 1: Last Day to Vote Absentee In-Person
- Nov. 4: Election Day

Fire Prevention Week - Oct. 5-11

Fire Prevention Week is October 5-11, 2014. The City of Manassas Fire & Rescue Department would like you to help out by testing your smoke alarms every month and by changing your batteries every six months.

Did you know that in 2011, U.S. fire departments responded to more than 370,000 home structure fires? These fires caused 13,910 civilian injuries, 2,520 civilian deaths, and \$6.9 billion in direct damages.

On average, seven people died in U.S. home fires per day from 2007 to 2011. Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries, followed by heating equipment. Smoking is also a leading cause of civilian home fires.



Help your local fire department keep you safe by taking steps to prevent fires before they start. Here are some easy ideas to keep you fire safe:

- Have a smoke detector placed outside each sleeping area
- Designate two escape routes out of each bedroom and practice using them
- Let children know that it is never good to play with matches or lit candles

- Keep home heating devices away from flammable materials
- Never smoke in bed. Smoke outside if possible.

New Sidewalks in the City

The City has received positive feedback from residents who have already seen a reduction in the number of plastic trash bags curbside on collection day.
